## *Holy Week*

Worship on March 20 will feature a **Palm Sunday** Band, directed by Vicki Moore. They will play two hymns (standing still, not marching!) - "Ride On, Ride On, in Majesty" and "All Glory, Laud, and Honor." Please contact her for rehearsal times if you would like to play your instrument. The choir will sing "Fling Wide the Door" by Yarrington and the festive anthem "Serve the Lord with Gladness" by Handel.

The week between Palm Sunday and Easter includes two nights for the choir. On Thursday, March 24 the **Maundy Thursday** service will be held in the dining room from 5:30 – 7 PM. There will be singing with Matt Burke during the agape meal, but the choir will NOT formally sing any prepared anthems. The choir will rehearse at 7 PM in the loft, with the Monadnock Brass coming to practice also.

The **Good Friday** service at 7 PM on March 25 will include two anthems by the choir. The singers should arrive in the loft with robes at 6:30 PM.

**Easter** worship on Sunday, March 27 indoors will begin at 10 AM, with a musical Prelude beginning at 9:40 AM. The Ringers-On-The-Square handbells, Senior Choir, and Monadnock Brass Quintet will combine to offer a stirring arrangement of "The Day of Resurrection" by Moglebust. The congregation will be invited to sing Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus"! Copies of the music will be available at the top of the stairs to the choir loft. See you then.
